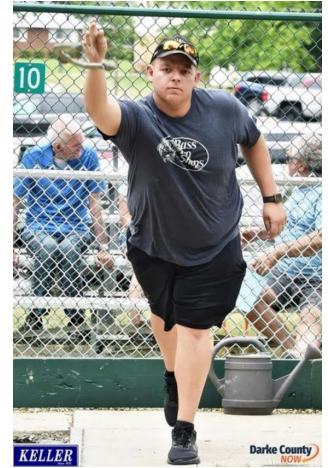

NHPA Committees staffed and active

It's hard to believe we are already 3 months removed from the 2024 World Tournament in Kennewick and things have been moving quickly on the council. In the past few months we've reassigned job duties, implemented new positions and began working towards new ideas to grow our membership and improve the experience of being an NHPA member. When I stepped into the role of 3rd Vice President, there were no standard operating procedures apart from a couple of pages about expense reports. I began developing these and they will be available very soon. These are very important to ensure we're operating properly and progressively.



In the previous edition of the Newsline, I stated that the committee appointments would be announced by September 15th, this did not happen. It took longer than I had anticipated to fill out these committees, but these appointments have now been made and are in this edition of the Newsline. We will be working to make several updates to our website in the next couple of months to make this easier to navigate and give it a fresh look.

A couple of weeks ago, I sent out an excel sheet to each charter president asking for each charter to update their charter contact information. So far, I've only received about 15 of these back. If you haven't sent this in yet, please email it to me as soon as you can. Working directly with the charters will be very important to our success and membership growth in 2025.

Speaking of membership, our 2024 membership has been finalized and we ended the year with 6,262 adult members, down from 6,632 adult members last year, following the trend of the last several years. We also had 18 less youth pitchers in 2024, for 421 total youth members. Eliminating 2020 and 2021 (spikes due to Covid), NHPA membership has decreased between 4% and 6% every year for the past 14 years, averaging roughly 5% year over year. I've attached the adult membership chart from 2010 to 2024, as you can see, we must stop this trend. We have been working on ideas to reverse this trend and begin to increase our membership again.

One thing we've looked at is non-renewals. I received a report with all the members that haven't renewed since 2019, our promotions committee will begin reaching out to these members to evaluate why they didn't renew and utilize that data to find ways to attract these lost pitchers back to the NHPA. From the reports I received, it appears that we are gaining many new members each year, as many as 1,000 in some years. The issue is that we're having members not renew for various reasons at a faster rate, we'll be working to stop this bleeding in 2025.

This brings me to how we gain new members, we've been looking at this as well. In the coming months, we'll begin to roll out new incentives and initiatives for new members and members who recruit members to join the NHPA. We realize that there are many, many backyard pitchers who simply don't participate with the NHPA. We must find ways to attract these and other pitchers to the NHPA. We will begin to increase and highlight the benefits of NHPA membership extending well beyond the world tournament that we've focused on too heavily for far too long.

Speaking of membership, I was very proud to announce our partnership with Grouper. Grouper has included an article in this Newsline and is ready to take your call to check your eligibility. We have had many eligible members contact Grouper already! Grouper is a program that pays individuals with a qualifying healthcare plan an annual and quarterly incentive just for being an NHPA member and pitching in NHPA tournaments. This is a great benefit to those members who qualify.

Membership and Sponsorship are two things that go hand in hand, therefore we have appointed a new sponsorship committee and sponsorship director in Don Sorenson. We have been working diligently to update the very outdated and insufficient sponsorship model that has been floating around for several years. We intended to release this model much sooner, but it will be on the website in November. We had to check on a few manufacturing costs to get the pricing right. I'm very proud to announce that our sponsorship levels will be much more affordable and valuable to businesses and individuals who wish to sponsor the NHPA in some way in 2025. We will begin providing options for sponsorship as low as \$100 and up with a wide range of options for those wishing to sponsor at different levels.

Membership growth and Sponsorship will be very important to keep the NHPA moving forward financially in 2025, as we begin to make much needed upgrades to our World Tournament equipment and pursue further promotional efforts.

Yet another thing we're looking at is regional tournaments during the calendar year. This is something we could see as soon as 2026! We are looking at how this would be structured to not interfere with other major events in the country, while providing more major events for pitchers across the country.

Before that though, NHPA members have long been asking for a double's tournament at the world tournament. This would be difficult due to the time it takes for the singles event. However, we made the announcement that this year would be the last for the National Sanctioned League Tournament, due to the low participation in recent years. We intend to provide a better alternative though, as we are looking to hold a World Doubles Championship event around the same date in 2025! We'll announce more information about this in the January edition of the Newslines so stay tuned!

Looking ahead to next summer, it brings us to the 2025 World Horseshoe Pitching Championships in Sandy, Utah, located just outside of Salt Lake City! The NHPA council is excited to have our marquee event in Utah and we've begun working on the planning of the tournament. We are hoping to see a much higher turnout this year in Utah and signups will be available before the end of 2024!

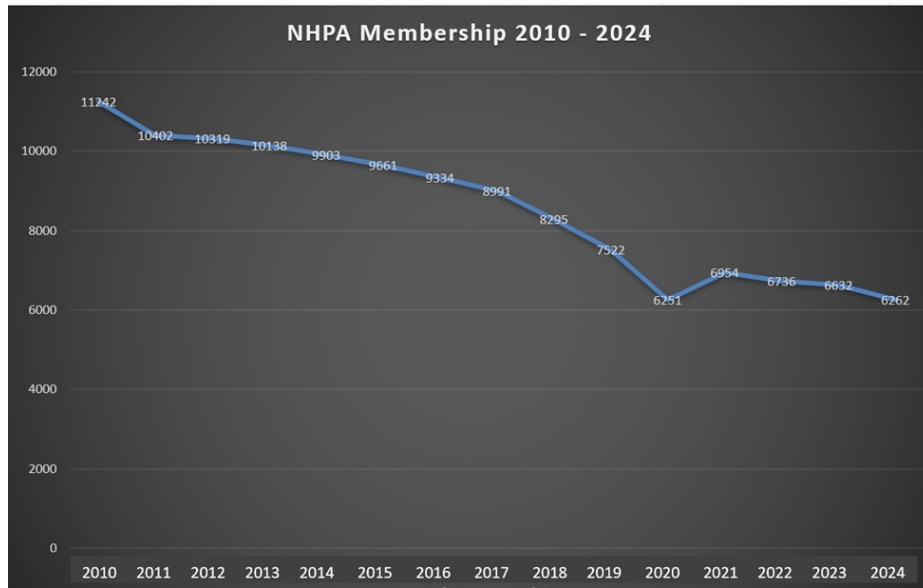

The NHPA Council has been hard at work with the newly installed officers, directors and committee members, exploring new promotional avenues to grow our membership. We initiated several programs already to increase the number of promotional products offered to our members, our agreement with Grouper, along with other incentives that will be coming in 2025!

I began working directly with the NHPA as the Youth Director. The excitement of our young members is very motivating to the individuals in these roles to keep going, to ensure a future of organized horseshoe pitching for them. I would argue that our youth divisions are one of, if not, the most critical divisions of the NHPA, without youth there is no tomorrow for the NHPA.

The NHPA council met for our monthly meeting and made two unanimous decisions to support these divisions in new ways. We, as a council, recognize that the NHPA is at its most critical point, and this sometimes calls for unprecedented decisions to be made. There were many ways to do this, but it was decided to go with the simplest method possible to reduce confusion and encourage more participation. The following incentives will be offset by a combination of previously allocated categories of our annual budget and other sources of income.

Therefore, for the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association membership year of 2025, the NHPA portion of membership dues for *Junior Boys, Junior Girls, Cadet Boys, and Cadet Girls* divisions will be waived. The listed divisions will still need to pay their charter dues, where applicable. For example, in Kentucky, youth division dues are \$6, a youth pitcher in 2025 will only pay the state portion of that (\$1), and not the NHPA portion (\$5). We are aware that many states do not require charter dues for these divisions, this is a great thing. This incentive will allow every charter to advertise free or very reduced youth pitching in 2025! If you have already paid your youth dues for 2025, we will be issuing those \$5 reimbursements soon.

Our goal with this program is to not only incentivize more and more youth pitching in the NHPA but to encourage more families with multiple youth pitchers to join, embracing the family friendly aspect of our sport.

In the same vein of encouraging youth participation, the promotions committee has pledged \$500 of their annual budget to support our young players as well. Therefore, the first 20 youth pitchers who sign up for the 2025 World Horseshoe Tournament in Sandy, Utah will have their World Tournament entry fee reimbursed in its entirety! All youth participants will need to pay their entry fees for the tournament but the first 20 that submitted their entries will be reimbursed at the conclusion of the preliminary round at the world tournament. To be eligible for this incentive the participant must pitch in the preliminary round of the world tournament.

Entries for the 2025 World tournament will open on December 1st, 2024!

The publicity committee is directed by Michelle Foard, I can speak on that committee's behalf. We have met over email thus far and have had a Zoom meeting to discuss what our focus point on publicity will be. Barry Webster has quickly taken the initiative to re-brand the NHPA with our new slogan going into the 2025 membership season of "Where friends become family." Look for more photos and acquired interest posts from him in the future. The committee is also looking into publicity around Sandy UT for the world tournament. We are currently working on our local clubs and how we can effectively provide them tools for publicizing their clubs and courts. We have taken the initiative to provide flyers and design them. As we are still in the beginning stages I can report more on this after the holidays.



I quickly jumped into the position, and I skipped out on the first sports conference for the NHPA back in September. It was just too quick after taking over and I felt I wasn't ready to attend and solicit bidders for our 2030, event. However, October 14-16, it was time for S.P.O.R.T.S.: The Relationship Conference, and I was ready to go. I was glad this was my first one and I sure learned many things. I was so happy to meet people and start the learning process. One might ask "why am I going to these events, we are secured until 2030!" Well, it truly is necessary to build the connections and relationships now to have established relationships with destination cities in time for our bid deadline in 2028 for 2030. I met with so many people and made friendships. I am looking forward to the new process and so are the suppliers. It was comical, several destinations are interested but they stated things like "our new facility won't be complete until 2028." When I mentioned we are booked until 2030, they were shocked and amazed. There are so many destination sites that want to bid and are hoping to. After this first event, I can report to you, that length of our world tournament is not an issue. Neither is hotel costs or parking fees. The problem lies with the major thing, we require our venue space to be waived or paid for AND we must take in a \$21,000 bid. This is a hinderance and problem when trying to solicit new suppliers for our event. They are skeptical of the risk and feel it's too much. Some ask if they provide the venue space for free, can they eliminate the bid fee and vice-versa. However, sites like Monroe LA, Tri-Cities WA, and Wausau WI all see the benefit of their investment. So, there may be a point where we will be competing in the same venue spaces simply because the new suppliers aren't willing to risk that funding and budget to our event. However, I feel there are many new suppliers still interested and ready to make an NHPA WT Commitment. Thank you, Stephanie, of S.P.O.R.T.S. for emailing me and getting things setup for me to attend. She is awesome and I hope to introduce her in the Newsline to everyone soon.

I was graced to be asked to come to Wichita, KS early for the Pre-FAM tour of S.P.O.R.T.S. I want to personally thank Kyle Baldwin of Visit Wichita for the early arrival pickup and the meeting selection. I have been working with Kyle since taking over on a WT option in Wichita. I want to thank ALL of Visit Wichita for the amazing experience I received on this tour. Being able to see the site and join the other four selected sports organizations arriving early was excellent. I enjoyed hanging out with Jessica V., Josh, and Jessica B. I look forward to working with them all as a potential for our event. I asked about insurance costs and Pete mentioned they pay almost \$600k for insurance for their association. When I asked Jenipher about their membership, she stated there were only 435 people to compete at the Nationals and the entry fee is \$600/division. So, if you enter singles, doubles, and teams that is \$1800 and it's paid by each player. So teams of 4, each pay \$600 totaling \$2400 for that team. Matt from USA Team Handball said the CEO of Verizon plays Team Handball and that is their sponsor. This is his only job, and it comes with benefits and travel. Just to put things into perspective on the comparison of NHPA to other sports around the world.

I can't forget to thank my partner in crime for the event Mr. Jim Newboles! He came to each appointment session and sat in on the events. He was able to make connections with several places around Kansas and even took over an appointments for me when I had to step out. It was great to have him around and help learn things with me. Look for great things to come from the Kansas charter. Thank you, Jim! You are now not the only friend I have in Kansas anymore, inside joke! HA!

Closing this article I am going to start a new segment titled "Sports Connection." It will feature sports that I had the privilege to meet executives and members from at these conferences. Meet Luis Hernandez and Lasso Safe! Introduction



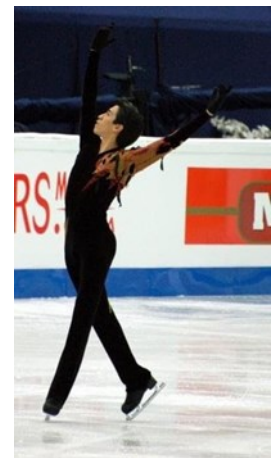
When I look back on my journey as a professional figure skater, I see a world filled with unforgettable moments of triumph alongside deep challenges that shaped the person I am today. From becoming a 6-time National Champion to representing my country on the world stage, the rink was not only a place of passion but also a space where I learned hard lessons about what it means to be both an athlete and a human being. Through it all, I've come to understand that while talent and hard work are critical to success, the environment in which athletes train (and compete)—one that prioritizes their well-being and safety—is just as essential. This realization is what led me to co-found Lasso Safe, a platform designed to

change the culture of sports by safeguarding athletes and ensuring that their mental, physical, and emotional health remains at the forefront.

Personal Journey

My love for skating began when I was just 4 years old. The rink became my second home, and by the time I was 13, I made the decision to leave home to train at one of the nation's top figure skating centers. I quickly rose through the ranks, and with that success came mounting pressure—not just from my coaches and organization but from my community, which expected me to deliver results.

By the age of 17, the weight of these expectations had started to take a toll on me, both physically and mentally. I pushed my body beyond its limits, training harder and longer, but something was missing. I wasn't being supported as a whole person; my mental health was deteriorating, and I felt lost. Then came the devastating news: I was diagnosed with career-ending injuries in both of my hips, and it seemed like my dream was over. I was told I would never perform again. Packing my bags, I sought answers. I wasn't ready to let go of my passion, but I needed to find a new way forward. That's when I crossed paths with Pamela Minix, my now co-founder. Pamela was working at a rehabilitation center for athletes in San Diego, CA, and while she didn't make any promises, she offered me something even more valuable—hope. Together, we began a journey to restore my body holistically. It was a slow process, but little by little, I started to rebuild, not just physically but mentally as well. I unraveled the harmful aspects of my training environment and learned that I was more than just an athlete—I was a human being who deserved to be healthy, both inside and out. This new perspective didn't just help me heal; it gave me the strength to return to the ice. In an unexpected turn of events, I found myself skating again, this time on my own terms. I no longer measured my worth by my results. With this newfound mindset, I went on to win 6 national titles and became a 4-time World Team member. It was a gift I wish for every athlete—the ability to thrive, not just succeed.

Lasso Safe aims to fill the gaps that currently exist in sports cultures by advocating for athlete safety in every aspect—mental, emotional, and physical. We work to provide resources, education, and tools that empower athletes, coaches, and sports organizations to prioritize wellness over pure performance. Through strategic partnerships, educational initiatives, and wellness evaluations, we're building a framework that supports long-term success while preventing the types of burnout and injury that I, and so many others, have faced.



At the heart of Lasso Safe is the belief that sports can be a place where individuals not only push their limits but also feel secure and valued as people first. We are creating systems that advocate for open conversations around mental health, the adoption of holistic recovery techniques, and the importance of safe training environments. Our vision is to see these values embedded in sports programs around the world, ensuring that athletes of all ages are given the care and respect they deserve.

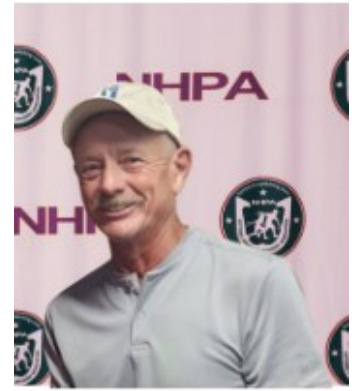

Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special tournament rules apply. Please see note regarding refunds.

READ CAREFULLY: An Adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN Men's Division regardless of age, just as any Adult Female may enter the OPEN Women's Division. To enter the Senior Division, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2025. Any Man/Women that turns 65 years of age in 2025, or has an approved Medical exemption may enter the Elders Division. Entrants in the Junior Boys and Junior Girls Division must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2025 calendar year. 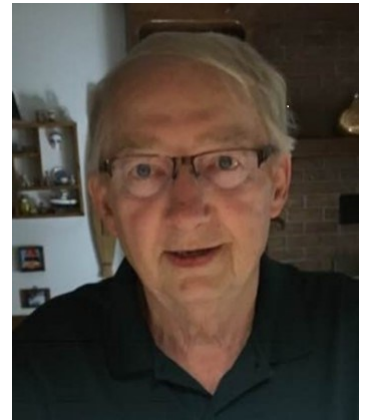

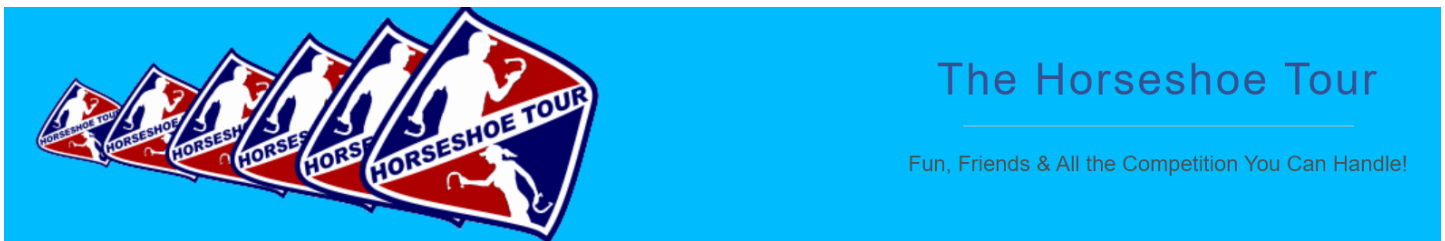
