<u>Monte Latino</u> – "Everyone knew him like he was a celebrity. People knew his car with the NHPA license plate frame, NHPA sticker in the back window", "He won uncountable AA division tournaments all over at the local and state level. In his prime he threw in the high 80 percentile"

<u>Roger Vogel</u> – "Roger has the distinction of being the only pitcher ever to win Men's State championships in five different states. Between the years of 1980-1982, he won titles in Illinois (4), Colorado (3), New Mexico (1), Texas (1), and Arizona (1)".

<u>**David Sidles**</u> – "He is a tireless worker and thinker and continues his quest to work with and for NHPA in several capacities. He has been decorated with any awards from every level and place of his involvement" A huge congratulations to the NHPA Hall of Fame class of 2025 as we look forward to our 2025 induction ceremony with these individuals, their friends, and families!



When I appointed Jerry LaBrosse back to the council in the summer of 2024, it was with the intent that Jerry would help raise our WT setup standards again, along with his other responsibilities. Recognizing over the past couple of years that the quality of our setup had slipped a little from previous years, it was necessary to reign this back in and standardize our setup process. We have plans soon to repaint the lines on our matting for the pitching lanes on all our WT courts, and to phase out some of the older equipment. Jerry quickly identified our inventory was very low on what we need to successfully conduct the WT and was able to identify a source to bring us several pieces of equipment that will last us for years to come at a very reasonable price. We have reached a verbal agreement and will soon be coordinating the transfer of this equipment.

Coming out of our winter meeting, our IT Director Josh Olson, had identified the need to upgrade our operating system for the WT. Our computers had become outdated and obsolete, causing several system issues when trying to conduct the event. The council unanimously voted to allow Josh to coordinate the purchase of new laptops to be used beginning in 2025. Josh is working with several of the larger computer manufacturers to get us the best possible pricing on this new equipment.

Newberry Kickoff

The 2025 Spring horseshoe pitching season is just on the horizon with many local parks beginning to see more and more traffic as warm weather approaches. Most charters have already set their pitching schedules for the year and we're in the best time to begin promoting your leagues and tournaments. I encourage all event directors to take advantage of free advertising: Newspaper stories, local Facebook group posts, community stories at local news stations, etc. Pre-season is the best time to get that new pitcher interested with a full season of events ahead of them.

Looking beyond local tournaments is where I intend to begin my pitching season for the spring of 2025. As someone who doesn't pitch many winter events, I participated in 1 tournament in Somerset, Kentucky with a sub-par outing from months of not pitching. With the warm weather increasing though, I'll begin practicing and preparing for my first event of the spring season. Consistent with recent years, I'll be travelling to Newberry, South Carolina for the kickoff of the Horseshoe Tour season at the Sue Snyder Memorial. This is always a great, early season event that begins on Friday night with the Horseshoe Tour Hall of Fame ceremony. This year's Tour HOF inductees include Ron LeGrand-MO, Pat Pertuit-LA, Jerry Dean-MD, Bob Koontz -SC, JoAnn Stanford-TN, Ellen Perry-NY, and current NHPA 2nd Vice President Dalton Rakestraw-CA! Congratulations to all of the 2025 Horseshoe Tour HOF inductees! If you've never participated in a horseshoe tour event, Newberry is a great place to kick off your year. A great, fun filled weekend with horseshoe friends, competing in a unique format you just can't get anywhere else!

Following the Newberry Tour tournament, I'll be travelling to our own Hall of Fame building in Wentzville, Missouri to compete in the annual HOF invitational tournament. A tournament that's showcased horseshoe pitching talent unlike any other in recent years. Outside of the World Tournament, this tournament brings a highly competitive, two-day tournament of 15 games between the top 16 pitchers in the world in both the 30 and 40foot divisions. The top 16 pitchers based on ringer percentage from each distance enter the tournament, from there playing a round robin of 15 games over just two days for a grand prize of \$1,200 in each division. Each match creates an unpredictable round that can see any top pitcher rise or fall in the standings.

From April until September, the season is in full gear with weekly tournaments, leagues and other events going on all across the NHPA! Where will you be beginning your 2025 horseshoe pitching season?



A Woman Who Sees With Her Heart

Paula Schwerdtfeger, (Kobelman) loves to pitch horseshoes. She wants to do her best and she is very competitive. Paula will welcome you with open arms to practice with her, at her courts at home, but be prepared. Paula practices late at night without lights illuminating the courts.

Earlier this year, Paula pitched at Summit Ridge in Wonewoc, WI, an indoor horseshoe facility, and finished in second place. So, what is so unusual about the second-place finish and pitching in darkness? Paula is legally blind.

When Paula's opponents meet her, most will never know of her condition as she does not walk out on the court with the aid of a white cane.

Paula can make out blurred shadows and objects in close proximity, however, her balance is crucial. Often, you will see Paula outstretch her arms like the wings of an airplane to maintain her balance.

Paula and I have worked together at many tournaments to help her determine stance and landing of her horseshoes. The problem, our vocal communication back and forth was a disruption to the other pitchers. I knew this was not going to be acceptable at the State Horseshoe Tournament, therefore, we submitted a request to the Board of Directors of the Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association, (WHPA), to allow the use of 2-way radios for communication purposes for Paula and her spotter. The WHPA unanimously voted yes.

At the Wisconsin 101st State Horseshoe Tournament, held in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, I believe Paula was the FIRST blind person EVER to compete in a State Sanctioned Horseshoe Tournament.

Paula will pitch against you with or without the use of a spotter. The only problem, unless Paula hears the clang of her shoe landing against the stake, she has absolutely no idea where her shoe landed.

So, I am Paula's eyes. With the use of two-way radios, her opponent has no idea that I am communicating with her. It begins with her stance, posture and position on the court. If we cannot determine a suitable benchmark in the pitcher's box, often I will make a small mark with chalk so that Paula can adjust her stance.

After Paula is comfortable with her stance, Paula lofts her first horseshoe. I use letters and numbers much like the game, "Battleship" to allow her to zero in on the stake. During one of the matches at Summit Ridge, her opponent pitched their horseshoe and it landed upright in front of the stake. This time, I told Paula there was a leaner in front of the stake. "Pitch a little softer and a little higher". Paula nodded telling me she understood, pitched her horseshoe, and lofted a ringer perfectly.

Paula's next goal is to pitch at The World Horseshoe Tournament, providing the use of two-way radios is approved by the NHPA.

Paula encourages everyone to go after their dreams and not let a disability discourage them. I am proud to be Paula's friend.

So, my fellow horseshoe pitchers, if you are ever having a bad day on the courts, try pitching with a blindfold on.



Encouraging the Next Generation The Power of Sportsmanship in Horseshoes?



Why Have Halls of Fame?

NATIONAL HORSESHOE Halls of Fame exist to publicly recognize and celebrate individuals who have achieved exceptional excellence in a particular field, usually sports, by preserving their history, inspiring future generations, and serving as a tangible

reminder of the highest standards within that domain; essentially acting as a way to honor the "best of the best" and showcase the legacy of a sport or industry to the public.

Key points about Halls of Fame:

Preserving History:

They act as a repository of information and memorabilia related to the achievements of notable individuals, allowing people to learn about the past and how the field has evolved.

Inspiration and Role Models:

By highlighting outstanding accomplishments, Halls of Fame can motivate aspiring individuals to strive for greatness.

Community Building:

They can bring together fans and enthusiasts of a particular sport or field, creating a sense of shared pride and connection to the legacy of the game.

Educational Value:

Many Halls of Fame operate as museums, providing educational exhibits and historical context around the achievements of inductees.

The Horseshoe Pitching Hall of Fame came officially into existence in 1966 with the selection of seven charter members as the games outstanding personalities of the past. The seven charter members of the newly formed Hall of Fame would be officially honored and installed at 4 ceremonies during the 1966 World Tournament in Murray, Utah, next August. Their names and pictures would be inscribed on a permanent plaque which would be placed on display at major tournaments all over the United States in the future.

It wasn't until 1996 that the NHPF was formed. One of its goals was to have a permanent home for a NHPA Hall of Fame. After many difficulties but with the leadership and guidance of Dave Loucks, Joe Faron, and certainly Dr. Jack Freeman, on May 6th, 2006 ground was broken at the current location in Wentzville, MO. Today you can see displays of all the Hall of Fame members as well as historic artifacts and memorabilia from over 100 years of horseshoe pitching.

All of this is made possible primarily through the financial support of people who have been involved in the sport of horseshoe pitching at all levels. The continuing role of the NHPF is to work with the NHPA in promoting and advancing the sport. Your taxdeductible donations are always welcome and always appreciated. Something Old Brings Something New to the NHPA/NHPF Hall of Fame in Wentzville, Missouri

If you haven't been to the NHPA facility in Wentzville, MO lately, you will be surprised what Rich and Mary Altis have created by adding more horseshoe history to the building.

Bob Dunn, the late NHPA Historian from Minnesota, had a great passion for the sport of horseshoes especially his interest and knowledge in the different types of horseshoes which he proudly displayed at world tournaments. He also wrote many books and the column "The Horseshoe Trader" which appeared in the Newsline Magazine. Throughout the years he collected hundreds and hundreds of horseshoes from across the USA which was stored in his basement. Tragedy struck when Bob was in a fatal car accident which ended his life on September 26, 2018.

Bob's family and the NHPA officers decided to ship the shoes and books to the Hall of Fame facility in Wentzville. With the help of several NHPA members, Jerry LaBrosse, Jerry Smith and Jim Kinney volunteered to gather the items and began transporting them to Missouri. Most shoes were loose in boxes and dumped into a couple of large crates. Rich Altis spent three months to separate, identify and record the rack location of Bob's shoes that had not been on display boards.

The shoes remained locked away in the Game Related Sales room as the years went by. In 2023 Jerry Smith, former National League Director, was at the HOF facility and the discussion of where and how to display the eighteen pegboards with their horseshoes was decided. QRHC members, Norm Pierce, Steve Gamache, and Mark Neubauer, cut and fixed the braces to help enforce the shelf where the shoes would eventually be on display.

Rich and Mary began gathering material for this project in December 2024 and worked diligently almost every day putting in many, many hours to complete it. New pegboards and zip ties were purchased. The horseshoes on the old pegboards were removed, sorted by age, style and manufacturer and attached to the new pegboards. The making of the labels was very time consuming as they had to fit inside of the horseshoes, not all the horseshoes were the same size and shape. The labels were laminated and centered inside each shoe. The nineteen new 2' X 4' pegboards held 339 shoes. With the help of the QRHC members they were able to install the display in the north pavilion (the Dave Loucks Courts) for all to see. QRHC members Steve, Mark, Dave Krzyzanowski and Dave Sullivan installed the new display. The horseshoes, in many colors against the white peg boards, are a brilliant collection and sight to see. During this project Rich and Mary became so involved in the history of horseshoes learning many facts and features of each horseshoe.

Rich was looking for a rare 1934 Gordon Spin-on which had Ted Allen's name on the shoe. That shoe would make a great addition to the collection. Mark Neubauer found a collector, Jeff Ferguson in the state of Washington, who had two pair of Madison Ace shoes which have a heart shape on one blade and the words Pat Pend on the points. The toe and heel calks are very unique not to mention the raised heart on the blade. The calks of the Madison Ace are identical to the calks of the Madison shoe of 1936. While talking to Jeff, Rich asked if he would be willing to part with a pair of the shoes. With a little bit of horse trading, the shoes soon arrived.

We need to thank the horseshoe collectors for their time and donations to make the history of horseshoes more meaningful and appealing. Rich and Mary feel sure that Bob Dunn would be pleased with what they have done with the boards and displays that he collected and took to many of the world tournaments.



Managing the eShoe system!

We are constantly working on making eShoe a user-friendly experience in every aspect of the program from looking up percentages to entering events. I am responsible for granting access to the eShoe program. We try and limit access to three primary users.

- Secretary/Membership Director renews and manages membership
- Regional Director works with Tournament Directors and entering events
- Charter presidents monitors their charter


I have had requests to give access to other then these three primary Officers in the charter. The only one who should be granting this additional request at the charter level is the President. If the Officer who has been granted the additional request starts abusing their position I will remove their user access. This is the reason we try to keep access to three for each charter.

There is another issue that comes up periodically—online renewal of membership. When you go to the NHPA website it will have two buttons to choose from. If you are an existing member or have held a membership since 2019 you will choose "RENEW". When you choose this button and you cannot access your membership, you will have to contact myself or the charter secretary you are renewing for. If you have moved from one charter to another you will have to contact myself or the secretary of the last charter you were a member of. Do Not use the JOIN button if you have ever been a member of the NHPA prior to the 2025 membership year. This duplicates your membership by assigning a new membership number. This is easy to correct if this happens, but I need to be notified so the charter can receive the correct billing on the NHPA invoice.

If you are a new member and have never been a member of the NHPA then you will choose "JOIN" and proceed to the page where it states, "Become an NHPA member". I am here to help with anything that pertains to the eShoe program. If I do not have an answer I have a team of experts who will be able to assist us.




